#### "European Financing of Regional and Municipal Projects"

How can European funding be obtained for important regional sustainability projects? This question will be raised at the beginning of the conference. The European Fund for Strategic Investments (EFSI) serves as an engine for investment campaigns, in case of market failure, to trigger market mechanisms and to mobilize private investment. The funds flow into strategic investments in key areas such as infrastructure, education, research, and innovation, and serve as risk capital for small businesses. The director of the EFSI, Wilhelm Molterer, will report on the details and methods of how to mobilize financial resources and investment financing. ## "Sustainable land management - challenges for Regions and Cities"

The topic of sustainable land use has gained importance in recent years. A farm of around 20 hectares, which equals 30 football fields, is being built on every day in Austria and 0.5 percent of the soil is (being) sealed every year. Given that this trend continues the entire agricultural soil of Austria will be covered with concrete in 200 years. In Germany and Switzerland only 0.25 per cent of the agricultural land is annually being build on and in the Czech Republic it is/it amounts to 0.17 percent.

Austria has 1.8 square meters of supermarket space (Italy only 1.01 square meters) and 15 meters of road length per capita (Germany 7.9 m and 8.1 m in Switzerland), which is the internationally highest construction number. In the EU, 275 hectares are (being) built on daily. Every year an area twice the size of Vienna is under construction.

This topic has high relevance for all regions and cities. A sustainable soil protection strategy requires the interaction of spatial planning instruments with other measures such as incentives for restoration of vacant properties. The knowledge of the value and limitations of our livelihood soil must be increased amongst all relevant stakeholders.

## "Sustainable Water Management – Essential Task for Regions and Cities"

The water problem in the world is getting worse. Climate change and the growing population contribute to the problem. Sufficient clean water must be made available for man and nature in the future. The supply of drinking water, agricultural irrigation, industrial production, power production, and the overall treatment and use of sewage, are criteria for a peaceful and prosperous development in the world. Problems arise when e.g. the capacity of local water resources is exceeded due to the growth of urban areas, a progressive industrialization or climatic change. Global, national and regional water problems need to be tackled by comprehensive concepts of sustainable water use. Additionally, it is important to reduce the damage caused by pollutants of all kinds to a minimum and apply the polluter pays' principle. Comprehensive political and economic concepts for careful handling of the water as well as initiatives of citizens, communities, businesses and governments for sustainable water policy are as necessary as the personal use of the scarce resource. Not only direct water consumption, but also the water usage for the production of products and goods such as food, paper and clothes needs to be reconsidered.

## The significance of cultural and historical heritage for regional tourism"

Cultural heritage has eminent touristic importance in virtually every country in Europe. However, cultural heritage is still not fully and sustainably applied in all regions and cities. The preservation of cultural heritage is increasingly becoming the focus of tourism planning. Sustainable tourism is particularly keen to preserve cultural heritage and to encourage the regional and local identity. Tourism loses its appeal, when cultural resources are lost. Sustainable tourism increases the interest for other cultures. This is especially true for urban tourism. Sustainable Cultural Tourism consists of the sustainable use of cultural and historical elements, relics and presentation of traditional regional forms of living. The understanding of nature and the characteristic value of a region shapes the broad framework of a European cultural unity. All regions can make use of their cultural heritage for sustainable tourism. Not only historic buildings and museums but what is known as cultural heritage, regional way of life, vibrant customs, rituals and festivals, are part of cultural identity. This includes craft techniques, agriculture, wine and cooking culture, and indigenous healing methods, which makes up the special charm of a region. Cultural practices are part of heritage and attract tourists. Presenting traditions in an innovative context will contribute to a sustainable regional development. The IRE symposium presents best-practice examples of/for the successful use of cultural and historical heritage and discusses several forms of sustainable tourism in regions and cities.




